BESPOKE SOLUTIONS

Moduloft offers an innovative and convenient alternative to a traditional loft conversion, with minimal hassle and upheaval. The company builds modular loft spaces off site in a factory, and these are then installed in two to three weeks. The process allows you to add an extra storey to almost any home, whether it has an existing loft space or not, subject to planning constraints.

Trussloft, meanwhile, has been completing traditional loft conversions for more than 20 years. This kind of conversion will take between eight and 12 weeks and requires an existing loft space with a height of at least 2.4 metres. Because the height of the roof isn't changing, planning

permission isn't normally needed, but you can check whether this will be the case at realhomes. co.uk/do-I-need-planningpermission-loft-conversion.

Both Moduloft and Trussloft provide a fully managed service. completing all necessary planning applications and legal submissions, and also appointing a third party building inspector to ensure the work complies with building regs.

THE PERFECT USE

The beauty of a loft conversion is that it can fulfil any purpose you require. Often it's about adding an extra bedroom and bathroom, especially if you have children who shared a room when they were vounger and now need their own space. Another popular use is as

a family room or play space with sofas, a TV and games consoles to allow you to relax.

Depending on your property and its location, you may even choose to switch to an upsidedown layout, with the kitchendiner in the loft where it can make the most of the views on offer.

It's essential to decide what the space is to be used for right from the outset, as this then carries through into your bespoke design - so everything from the layout to fixtures and fittings will be tailored to its planned purpose.

THE COST

To design, factory build, deliver and install a Moduloft unit containing two bedrooms and a bathroom would cost from
